STUDENT TRANSFER REQUESTS/MOVING



As we continue to plan for next year, it is important we know how many students to expect. If you know your family will be moving and attending another school in September please let the office know.

Please note, Administrative Policy 305 4.1 reads:

Each year, students and parents will be given notice that they may, starting on March 1, request transfer to another school for the upcoming school year. Such notice shall be publicized in school newsletters and on the district website. Only transfer requests submitted in writing to the receiving principal and approved by students' parents shall be considered.

Please contact the office should you require a Transfer Request.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

We are still accepting registrations for Kindergarten for this coming September. General information can be found on the SD73 Website. In order for registration packages to be accepted as complete, they must include birth certificate, BC Services card, and proof of address (utility bill, rental lease, house purchase).

REMINDER ABOUT BIKES/SCOOTERS

Many students are riding bikes and scooters to school. Please bring a lock to school to ensure property is kept safe. A reminder that all students need to be wearing a helmet and practicing safe behaviour on bikes and scooters. For the safety of all, there is no riding or scootering on the school property. Students **must** walk their bikes once they arrive on the school grounds. This includes afterschool please.



NO BEFORE AND AFTERSCHOOL SUPERVISION

Just a reminder that there is **no** before or after school supervision and the school is not open for bathrooms, drinks etc. The school rules do still apply afterschool, and your child may be asked to leave the property if they are not abiding by school rules.
