**Note for Readers:**

Please be aware that a portion of the Regular Bank account balance is reserved for specific purposes, such as prepaid Popcorn and Hot Lunch programs or the Breakfast Program. This reserved funding is not available for general disbursement. When reviewing the bank account balance, it is important to exclude these committed amounts to avoid misinterpretation of the actual usable balance.

**Budget Income Position Explanation: Hot Lunch and Popcorn****Hot Lunch Program:**

The current profit shown for the Hot Lunch program includes all prepayments for lunches scheduled through the end of Dec/June, as recorded in Munch-a-Lunch. Since some of these lunch dates are still upcoming, the associated supplier costs have not yet been incurred, which causes the profit figure to fluctuate and gradually decrease over time. The overall profit position is composed of two sessions—Fall and Spring—each contributing net profit to this budget line.

**Popcorn Sales:**

Similarly, the Popcorn budget position reflects both prepayments and ongoing sales. However, in addition to preorders, we also receive weekly income from off-sales, which helps offset some of the associated expenses. As a result, fluctuations in the profit figure are expected to be more minor, and we will even see a slight increase in net profit over time

## Addendum A: Chair's Report

### Focus Goals:

Goal 1: Strengthen our local commitment to family inclusion through accessibility awareness and accountability. As our communities and neighbourhoods grow, and our world shrinks and expands, the realities, experiences and needs of our families becomes more diverse. The economic challenges we hear about so often from our District also impact our families. How are we making sure our PAC activities and our school investments are equitably available to all students and caregivers? Are we taking into account the needs of all students and families? Are we representing them or are we including them in representation? We need to lead by example.

Goal 2: Create a vision for student-focused planning and reporting that families can access and understand when it comes to how we meet the needs of each individual child in our community. I'd like to know that the decisions made at every level in our education system have been considered in the context of how they value each learner. I'd like to know that the needs of students with disabilities have been considered, that vulnerable learners are invested in as they identify their needs, not as they can be after the obligations to all are met. Do we plan for the whole child, the whole community and our children's families who will likely attend the same schools we are trying to get build now. Every decision in our District should consider EACH child. I would like to see us lead that work.

### Supporting PACs:

- -Answered questions and supported PACs in their governance issues as they arose.
- -Continue to work towards obtaining district support for the Safer Streets program and @20,000 grant to be available to a school community in Kamloops
- -Provided support and guidance to individual caregivers navigating procedures as they relate to school inclusion and planning for students.

### District Advocacy:

- Attend partner engagement meetings with SD73, KTTA, CUPE, BCPVPA leadership monthly.
- Virtually attend Board meetings and review all Board packages and correspondence
- Review first quarter financial statements and 25/26 projected budget
- Met with Superintendent and Secretary-Treasurer to provide input on parent priorities for the amended budget
- Met with Kamloops City Council members in advance of the annual City/School District Planning meeting to address parent concerns regarding long-term planning and forecasting
- Researched provincial standards and investment in Board composition and size to measure our district investment in governance compared to other jurisdictions.
- Many media hits and opportunities to share parent values publicly.

### Provincial Advocacy:

- Continued work with other DPAC leaders and partners to advance critical education issues with the province. Budget dropped tonight.
- Media hits responding to the rural/interior challenges we experience with a provincial and national audience.
- Supported SD59 DPAC in managing post-incident communication with and for parents in their school community.

### Communication:

Most of the communication we have is discussed on other parts of the agenda tonight.

### Governance and Strategic Planning:

-Dylan has resigned his post as Secretary for personal reasons.

-Ongoing Priorities – the SD73 has more money than they thought they would have thanks in part to increased enrollment and more level 2 designated students, as well as a greater than anticipated classroom enhancement fund.

-Last year, we were invited in person to share our parent's priorities for the budget. We are still looking to get that invitation this year despite a rapidly closing timeline for feedback before the budget must be presented and approved. We have noted previously that our parents have asked for focus on increased classroom supports, supports for supplies and supports for students in the way of library, intramurals, field trips, mental health supports, food and lunch programming and career/experiential programming.
