

# Honour Roll and Achievements

## GRADE 8 & 9

### HONOUR ROLL

#### Academic recognition for grade 8/9 one certificate for the school year:

Grade 8 - all proficient and at least 1 extending in a core course.

Grade 9 - all proficient and at least 2 extending in any course.

Students who meet the criteria overall in the Semester 1 final and Term 3 will be recognized.

## GRADE 10 – 12

### ACADEMIC HONOUR ROLL

- **Grade 10 to 12:** Average marks in all courses must be 86% and no failing marks. Marks are based on Semester 1 final and Term 3.
- Getting an “IE” – you have 2 weeks after learning updates are published to have it changed to a percentage mark by the adjudication date
- Must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 courses. These courses are not considered in the count: TA, Peer Tutoring, IDS, Learning Assistance, Study, Leadership, Yearbook, Youth Work in Trades (SSA).
  - On-line course marks will only be considered if completed by the adjudication date.

### TOP ACADEMIC STUDENT AWARD

- Awarded to students in Grades 10-12, who have demonstrated overall excellence and outstanding performance in all areas of study. Grades 10: highest average percent calculated using a min. of 7 courses.
- Grades 11 & 12: highest average percentage calculated using a min. of 6 courses in each year.

### GOLD CORD

- Grade 12: Overall average must be 90% and no failing marks. Marks are based on Semester 1 final and Term 3.
- Getting an “IE” – you have 2 weeks after learning updates are published to have it changed to a percentage mark by the adjudication date
- Must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 courses. These courses are not considered in the count: TA, Peer Tutoring, IDS, Learning Assistance, Study, Leadership, Yearbook, Youth Work in Trades (SSA).
  - On-line course marks will only be considered if completed by the adjudication date.
  - \*For TRU students, the average will be calculated based on the final marks of the remaining courses.

### BLUE CORD

- Blue Cord is awarded to a student who has achieved Honour Roll status throughout their Grad Program years (Grades 10 -12).
- Grade 12 marks based on Semester 1 Final and Term 3.
