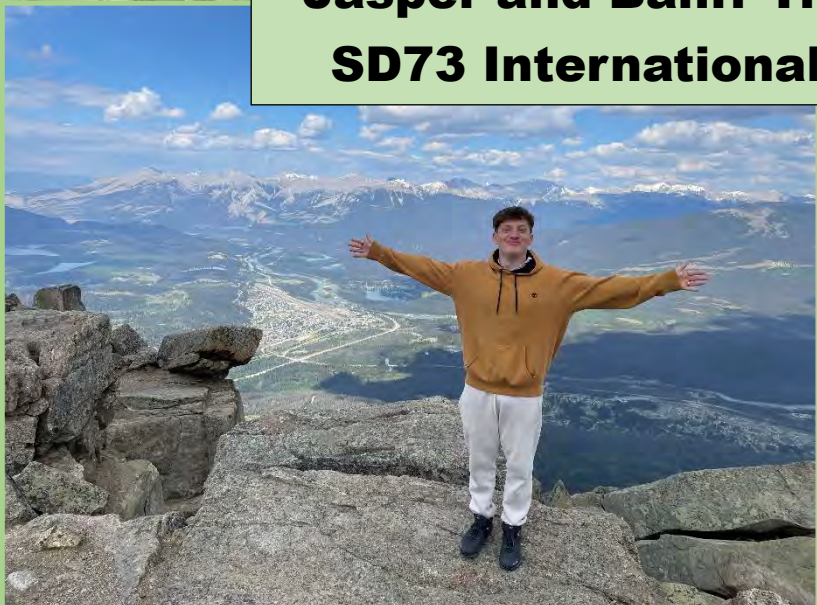




**Jasper and Banff Trip May 26-29, 2023
SD73 International Student Program**



Thirty students and four chaperones left Kamloops at 7:15am on May 26 and headed north on the Yellowhead Highway towards Jasper. We had a brief stop in Clearwater and lunch in Valemount and then posed by the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies → Mt. Robson (4000m). Once in Jasper, we drove directly to the sky tram and secured an earlier time than previously booked, giving us more time above the tree line. We enjoyed fantastic visibility and air quality (no wildfire smoke) for our entire time in Jasper and Banff. The red circle below shows the top of the sky tram.



We then drove the short drive to our hostel and checked in, grocery shopped, and had supper. At 8:00 we met on the bus for a wildlife drive. This drive resulted in several Black Bears, Hoary Marmots, Elk, and both Mule and White-tailed Deer.





The next morning, some of the students met for a morning wildlife drive. Unfortunately, we didn't see much except some lovely Rocky Mountain Bighorn Sheep rams on the way back to the hostel. After breakfast we went on a river float tour that lasted over an hour.





We then had a few hours of rest time to shop, buy food, or relax. At 1:00pm we met on the bus for a short ride to the Valley of the Five Lakes hike. This hike is around 5kms return and goes past five gorgeous turquoise glacial lakes. We stopped at a few of them and the students had the opportunity to walk into them to cool off.



Once back at the hostel, we had some time for supper before meeting again for a wildlife drive at 7:30. This drive did not result in very much so we were back at the hostel earlier than expected and roasted marshmallows for making smores over a campfire in the hostel fire pit. The burn ban had ended the day before we arrived which was perfect timing.



We enjoyed a later start to the next morning, meeting at the bus for a 9:00am departure. We drove south on the Icefields Parkway towards Banff with a brief stop at Athabasca Falls and a much longer stop at the Columbia Icefields where the Athabasca Glacier comes close to the road. We had two tours here: the glacier experience and walking on the glass-floored skywalk. Pictures of the waterfall and both tours below.







After the skywalk, we drove the last few hours south to Banff, encountering a few Mountain Goats on the way and taking in the spectacular scenery along this route. At Banff, we checked into our hotel and then had some time for dinner and shopping in the town. The next morning, we headed west back towards Kamloops with a brief stop at the famous Lake Louise and Revelstoke for lunch.
