Meetings: Every Tuesday at lunch in Mrs. Richter's room (room #111)

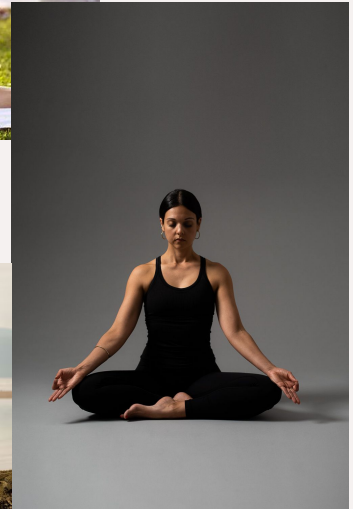
